

It was all a culturally rich and memorable place and experience, for some of us it was our favourite trip.






# Thursday

Finally, we were able to go to the gym, where we witnessed a choreography by the students on violence against women, followed by an hour in which we could socialize with the other students and play volleyball with them.




# Friday
